Purpose, Environment, Learning: The Look, Sounds, Feel, & Actions of an IBWS (Programme Standards & Practices 0101, 0201, 0402, 0403)

1 What?> IB Promises Exploration: We began our collaboration experience with packing our "backpack" with what we were calling The Promises of IB World Schools and the IB coordinator's roles as it relates to Programme Standards and Practices 0101, 0201, 0402, and 0403. The promises were derived from the IB Mission Statement and the aims of the IB Learner Profile. The definition for IB programme coordinators came from the *IB Coordinators Resource* on the My IB platform.



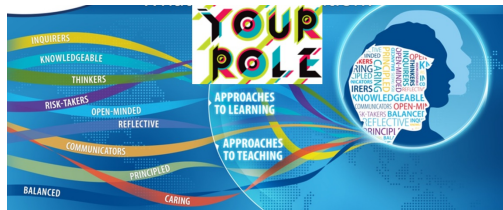
Young people who...

IB Mission Statement

- The International Baccalaureate aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

- These programmes encourage students across the world to become active, compassionate and lifelong learners who understand that other people, with their differences, can also be right.

2 So What?> Gaining Buy-in through

the IBWS Mission Promises, IBC Role Definition, & PSPs: We looked at what the *IB Coordinator Resource* document said about pedagogical leadership. Page 5 says, "Pedagogical leadership is essential to successfully carrying out the school's mission, vision and strategy as pedagogical leadership teams are responsible for the design, development and fostering of effective learning and teaching. **IB programme coordinators, through their work as pedagogical leaders, support the school's mission, vision and strategy.**" Finding ways to teach the school community what every IBWS needs to do and the IB coordinator's role in that journey was our mindset as we moved towards the World Cafe.

3 Now What?> Our World Cafe: We began our five 5-minute rotations as part of our IB Promises **World Cafe**. Our discussions were guided by a Project Zero Thinking Routine, **Feelings and Options** so we could 1- Explore initial thoughts about how we might deliver on the promises of an IBWS by identifying, feeling, imagining, and saying, and 2- Feel what it might be like if we implement this learning experience within our own school context.

We discussed one of our 5 designated promises with our table group and wrote our ideas and thoughts on the "tablecloths" then repeated this process at the next table. We were able to read the thinking of the group(s) that preceded us and make connections as well.





Identify- Who are the different people involved in the dilemma? What challenge are they facing?

Feel- What do you think each person in the dilemma is feeling? Why might the situation be hard or challenging for each of them?

Imagine- Imagine options for how the situation could be handled. Come up with as many ideas as possible. Highlight or circle which option might lead to the most positive outcome, where most people feel good or taken care of.

Say- Thinking more about the idea you chose for handling the situation, what could the people involved say?

Welcome to The World Café

Whether in small groups or in complex systems, it is through human conversation that we discover shared meaning, access collective intelligence, and evolve the future together. The World Café as a metaphor is a guiding image for this core process. It helps us visualize the ever-expanding networks of conversation and social learning that are at the heart of organizational and community life. The World Café process has demonstrated a remarkable capacity to foster authentic conversation and knowledge-sharing among people of varied backgrounds—even if they have never met or had formal dialogue training. Host a World Café conversation yourself. You might be surprised at what emerges!

STARTERS
To begin, gather a delightful assortment of diverse people. Ask them to recall a time that they've experienced a significant shift through the power of conversation and share. This experience with the group for inspiration.

ENTREES
The main course is a question to chew on. Here's one to try:
WHAT CONVERSATION, IF BEGUN TODAY, COULD RIPPLE OUT IN A WAY THAT CREATES NEW POSSIBILITIES FOR THE FUTURE OF _____?

DESSERTS
Come back together for a rich and delectable sharing of new insights and ideas, and watch the collective wisdom emerge.

TAKE OUTS
People often leave a Café conversation with a new level of shared understanding around key issues. By building on one another's knowledge, they will most likely see action choices they didn't even know existed before. The take-outs? Inspiration and the desire to make a difference. (No refrigeration required. Good ideas are not perishable.)
